I'm sure we all know Gary Cooper, that famous actor of the Golden Years of film. Did you know he grew up on a ranch in Montana? Here's a favorite recipe of his mother's from those years, as found in the 1931 cookbook "Favorite Recipes of the Movie Stars". 99

- 1 cup buttermilk
- ½ cup sweet cream
- 1 egg, well beaten
- 1 tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 tbsp butter, melted
- 2 tbsp cornmeal
- 2 cups flour

Mix ingredients in order given Drop by spoonfuls on a greased hot griddle. Cook on one side and when puffed, full of bubbles and well cooked on edges, turn and cook on other side. Serve with butter and maple syrup. Griddle cakes made from buttermilk have an unusually good flavor and are tenderer than those made from plain milk or water.

#### **Brands We Still Know**

In 1902 "The Texas Company" was founded by Joseph S. Cullian and Arnold Schlaet. The nickname Texaco began when a salesman saw the abbreviation in a telegram. Texaco did not become the official corporate name until although the name was used for as a product name in its first years. The first Texaco star logo came 1903, when a 19-year-old Italian refinery worker suggested the use of the star as a symbol of Texas. The green "T" was added a short while later.



1929 Advertisement

The company started out buying and transporting oil, but within a few years built a pipeline and refinery. Growth continued and expansion included international destinations as well. In 1926 the pipeline system in the United States had reached 1,800 miles. In 1928, the Texas Company became the first oil company to market refined products in then all forty-eight states.

Interesting note: In 1939, Texaco became one of the first oil companies to introduce a "Registered Rest Room" program to ensure that restroom facilities at all Texaco stations nationwide maintained a standard level of cleanliness.



#### Trouble Shooting the Generator Cutout



One of the most problematic items in the Model A charging system circuit is the cutout switch mounted on top of the generator.

The cutouts purpose is to isolate the generator from the battery when the battery is fully charged. It keeps the battery from being overcharged when the car is running and keeps connections. try rapping the battery from being discharged into the on the top of the cut out

generator when the car is stopped. (with the battery applied the with the handle of generator becomes an electric motor) this condition will run screwdriver, down the battery.

The cut out has a coil in it that senses the voltage differential Armature Spring between the generator and battery. Magnetism of the coil acts upon a movable armature that has a contact point mounted on it. It is repeatedly pulled into contact and the released. After some time doing this the points become burned, resulting in poor contact with the stationary point Also




the contacts may for some reason decide to weld themselves My suspicions are that the cutout is where most charging together. Wear at the pivot point of the contact armature could system problems lie. It may have to be replaced. If you have a also cause it to stick. The coil may lose its isolative quality's spare replacing the cutout might be the easiest trouble shooting and become shorted due to heat. All of these conditions can step. If so save the old cutout as it may be converted so that it cause cutout failure.

Check all connections including the generator ground connection and make sure that they are tight. I have found a loose generator connection and fixed it by tightening the generator mounting bolt. Ken Winkinhofer and I found a loose

connection we observed the generating system on his Tudor in a dark garage and saw arcing from the generator.

Check for loose battery might this cause a sticky cutout armature to release. See if can measure voltage to ground at the cutout output terminal. Try the same at the generator output. These measurements may help where determine the



problem is. With the engine stopped loosen the fan belt and see if the generator "motors" If so the cutout is stuck closed.



This time I covered the linings with 2 inch blue masking tape. This worked fantastic. I just simply left the tape on until after I finished assembling all the springs and miscellaneous parts. I remove the tape before the brake drums were installed.
